¹ Retail sales include over-the-counter, vending machines, and/or online.

² As used in this table, *e-cigarette* broadly refers to any product, and its component parts and accessories, that contains nicotine and/or other substances intended for use in the form of an aerosol, often referred to as vapor.

* Retailers are required to obtain a license to sell e-cigarette liquid, but not e-cigarette devices themselves.

† E-cigarette retailers who buy their stock directly from a North Carolina distributor/wholesale dealer or manufacturer do not need to obtain a license, while those who obtain their stock directly from manufacturers *outside* of North Carolina do need a license.
